The Schoharie River Center presents a cross-cultural bee summit which will take place from 2:00 – 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, October 19, 2014 featuring bee-keepers from throughout the Northeast who will discuss the folklore and practice of bee-keeping from Haitian and Ukrainian communities, as well as from communities in the Mohawk and Hudson Valleys of New York State. The Schoharie River Center is located at 2025 Burtonsville Road, Esperance, New York in the Town of Charleston, Montgomery County.
